Scottish Government 'Phase 3' Lockdown Easing As at 14th September 2020:

(note: any 'local lockdowns' supersede meeting guidance)

14 Sep: New meeting guidelines: <u>Indoors</u>: 2 households, 6 people <u>Outdoors</u>: 2 households, 6 people Meet up to 4 other households each day. 15 July: Places of worship can open for communal worship services with
limited numbers based on distancing (up to 50 max) and hygiene safeguards.
8 Aug: Face coverings MUST be worn.

15 July: Weddings & Funerals can take place with attendance of 20 people.14 Sep: wakes and receptions possible in venues with same numbers.

For **Scottish Episcopal Churches** this can mean starting to gather for worship:

10/7: pastoral visiting in people's houses can re-start with distancing/hygiene. **15/7**: churches can (but do not HAVE TO) re-open for distanced communal worship (no singing, max 50, face coverings) and weddings & funerals (max 20). 14/9: Vestry, meetings, social events cannot happen in person:
Govt meeting guidelines:
<u>Indoors</u> & <u>Outdoors</u>:
2 households, 6 people

Other Phase 3 <u>Govt per-</u> <u>mitted</u> users of premises (e.g. childcare) can restart activities with limits & agreement on cleaning.

All proposals to re-open church buildings and start services are a clergy/vestry decision.
